#### **Activities and achievements**

The 2020-21 season has been a very challenging one from every perspective for Dundee Orchestral Society. Obviously, due to Covid 19, this past year has not allowed any rehearsals or concerts to take place.

Thankfully we were eventually able to complete our purchase of a brand-new set of timps using money from our invested legacy. We are looking forward to getting a chance to use them. This has obviously impacted on our finances this past year but was planned and accepted as necessary and an appropriate use of these funds.

We cautiously planned a return to rehearsal in September 2021 with a concert in November. Hopefully this plan will be able to go ahead. We have planned a very different program so that we can accommodate social distancing at rehearsals and performance if necessary.

Very kindly, the Caird Hall have allowed us to carry forward our hire charge that we paid for March 2020 to our hopeful November 2021 concert date.

#### **Financial Review**

The overall accounts for the year shows a deficit of £28,164, all in all, a very difficult year. Luckily, we have been in a good financial position and been able to weather the storm. A few bills have come in from the previous financial year. We have had to continue to pay our insurance premium even though the insurance does not cover for Covid 19.

#### **Committee remuneration and expenses**

No member of the committee receives any remuneration for their services but may apply for reimbursement of out of pocket expenses arising from their duties.

#### Reserves

As a result of the deficit of £28,165 for the year, the society holds unrestricted funds of £52,972 at the year end. The committee are aware that this level of funds may be excessive for the immediate need of an amateur orchestra, but this situation has arisen due to a bequest of £40,394 in August 2012. This does ensure our financial future for years to come. It has encouraged us to put on some more ambitious programmes than we might otherwise have done.

#### **Dundee Orchestral Society Trust Fund**

This fund is administered separately by Trustees. The society receives the income from the Trust fund but has no entitlement to the Capital of the Fund.

#### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF DUNDEE ORCHESTRAL SOCIETY

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2021, set out on pages 7 to 11.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.
