TREASURER'S REPORT FOR DSO 2023-34 SEASON

It is the end of another DSO concert season. Yet again we have put on an amazing season of 3 wonderful concerts and have come through it in quite reasonable financial shape.

In November 2023 we performed the popular Rachmaninov Piano Concerto No.2 along with Borodin's "In the Steppes of Central Asia" and Tchaikovsky Symphony No.4. We engaged a young pianist who is under the tutelage of Fali Pavri – Maurizio Arroya Reyes. The audience figures were very good and it was greatly appreciated by audience and orchestra members.

In March 2024 we tried a new venture by doing an afternoon concert marketed as a children's concert. We performed "Peter and the Wolf," by Prokofiev, Rimsky-Korsakov's "Scheharazade" and Glinka's "Ruslan and Ludmilla". We engaged a professional narrator which worked well. We had fantastic ticket sales with over 100 children (who were all free entry but had to have adults with them). The feedback from the audience, friends and the Caird Hall was fantastic. Financially was definitely a success – loss was only £16.

In June 2024 we had our usual smaller concert in St Paul's Cathedral. We performed Wagner's Siegfried Idyll, Sibelius' Andante Cantabile, Weber's Concertino in Eflat major with our own Duncan Maynes as soloist and then Beethoven's Symphony No.7. We had great ticket sales for this venue and a great reception from the audience. We had a new venture in that we had a guest conductor who came in for concert week. He is our usual conductor's mentor from Germany. The audience and orchestra all seemed to appreciate the experience. In the accounts I have counted the expenses of this as the "soloist" fees as Duncan did not take a fee to perform. Unfortunately this concert made a loss of about £1500 but it is not possible to make a profit on this one. We also made the decision this year to purchase more of our own percussion equipment – totalling £2,588. We financed this by withdrawing £3,000 from one of our legacy investment accounts.

Overall we have made a loss of about £2000 over the concerts themselves.

In terms of income we have done quite well. We have gained £962.61 in interest from our invested legacy, gift aid has raised £1360 over the year. We

have been given £750 from one of the charitable trust (and promised the same for the next 2 years) and got £400 as an annual grant from DCC.

When balanced out we have made a loss for this accounting year of only ± 587 . But if we adjust this with the remaining costs and income due from June's concert this is in fact only a loss of ± 150 despite the substantial spend of equipment this year.

Going forward we have a great set of concerts for the coming season and hope to build on this season's successes. We are also trying to look at more fundraising ideas and have already run a very successful quiz night which raised £660 for next season.

Reserves

At the end of the year the society held funds of £52,423. The committee is aware that this level of funds may be excessive for the immediate needs of an amateur orchestra. This is largely due to a substantial legacy received by the orchestra in 2012. This has ensured our financial future for some years to

come and has allowed us to purchase new percussion equipment of our own and to put on more ambitious programmes than we might have otherwise done.

Dundee Orchestral Society Trust

This was set un anonymously many years ago for the benefit of the orchestra. It is administered separately by trustees. The society receives the income from the trust fund but has no entitlement to the Capital of the fund.
